



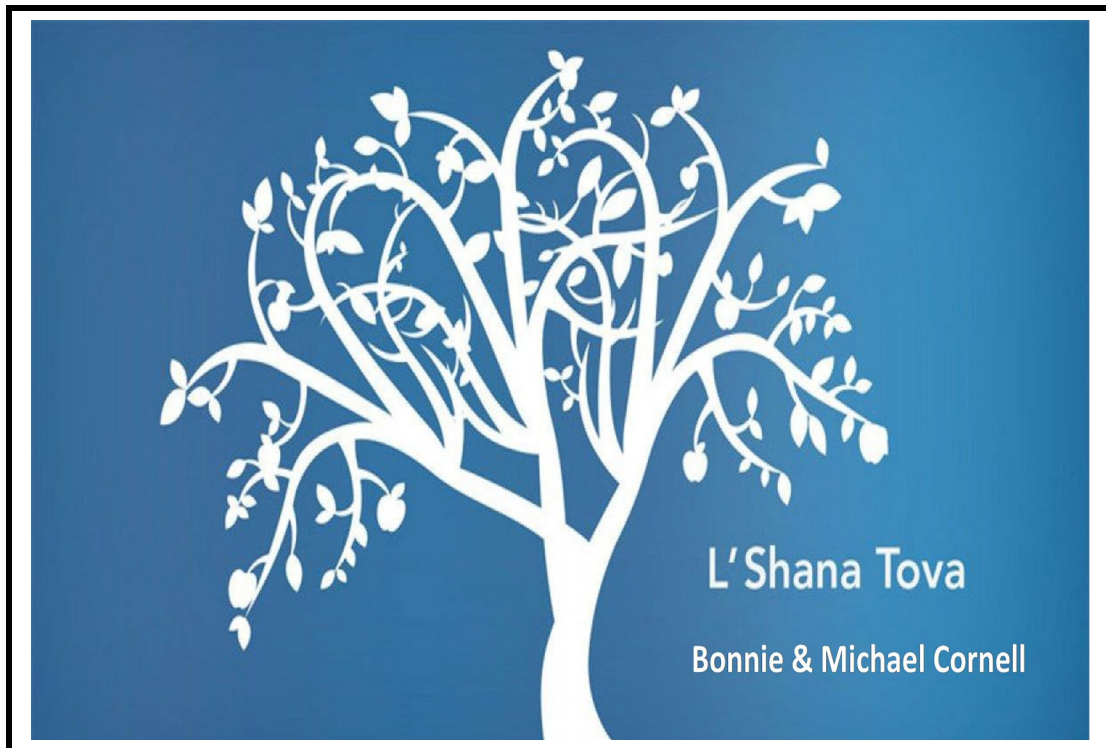

Approaches to Helping Refugees in the DMV

Sunday October 1, noon until 2 PM with lunch

Oseh Shalom Social Justice and Lifelong Learning Committees are co-sponsoring a panel discussion on October 1, 2023 from 12:00pm-2:00pm at Oseh Shalom (7515 Olive Branch Way, Laurel, MD 20807) on grassroots organizing for immigrant justice in the DMV. Our moderator will be Bill Frelick, director of Human Rights Watch's Refugee and Migrant Rights Division, and panelists will be Elias Johnson, Executive Director of Congregation Action Network; Bob Cooke, New Neighbors Interfaith Alliance Steering Committee Member; and Alan Sachs and Eileen Hollander, two congregants who have led Oseh refugee resettlement response. We'll invite panelists to share stories that illustrate the critical role of faith-based groups like Oseh Shalom in achieving justice for refugees. We are particularly interested in learning more about how they have built grassroots volunteer networks at the same time they are negotiating the bureaucracy across various state and Federal agencies and creating trust with immigrant families facing monumental challenges.
