Powerful Hope at a Seemingly Hopeless Time

For all of us who have the blessing and gift of being alive, the war between Israel and Hamas- in addition to the polarization and radicalization taking place across this earth - is frightening.

It can be so hard to feel hopeful about ... almost anything.

And yet, after a short 1-hour call last Thursday, I feel a powerful and rare sense of hope and possibilities for change that can create critical ripple effects around the world.

For me, when I look at the violence and suffering in Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank, I see a concentrated "model" of too many traumatized peoples controlling the narratives of fear and the need for violence that further inflicts trauma. The problems seem to me to be a sort of crystallized version of problems that exist with their own particular valence in other ways and in other parts of the world.

But where problems reside, amazing solutions **can** come forth from dedicated leaders, and as these solutions become clear and gain traction, they can likewise spread around the earth.

An amazing organization, <u>Inter-Act</u>, is hosting a series of 4 talks about <u>Israeli and</u> <u>Palestinian Women Peace Leaders</u>, and last week was the **inaugural event series at the InterAct Education Center**, which is dedicated to amplifying the peace-builders in Israel and Palestine, and providing critical educational content that inspires, uplifts and helps to build a better world.

Last week's topic was "What Does it Take to be a Woman in Leadership?" with **Rana Salman**, Executive Director of <u>Combatants for Peace</u> and **May Pundak**, Executive Director of <u>A Land for All</u>.

May Pundak noted that this time period is the biggest crisis for Israelis since the 1948 War of Independence. The opportunity of this time period is for Israelis to remember that unexpected solutions *can* indeed be arrived at, and now is indeed the time for that, for everyone is suffering in the current situation. As Rana Salman reminded us,, "when we act from 'an eye for an eye,' we end up with a lot of people walking around blind."
