

Life Long Learning Upcoming Events for 5785 [2024-2025]

Sunday, 10/27/2024 at 10 AM. Brunch and book discussion of *The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store* by James McBride, which opens with the discovery of a skeleton in a well in a small town. This introduction to the Chicken Hill area of Pottstown, Pennsylvania, sets up a sense of mystery as the narrative jumps back nearly 50 years to explore the town, its secrets and its people. Chicken Hill is a vibrant community of immigrants, Jewish and black people, resulting in a mix of characters with intertwined lives and shared histories.

Sunday, 11/3/2024 at 10 AM: Adam Reese will provide information to those Federal Government workers on choosing a Health Plan from the Federal Employees Health Benefit Program. Open Enrollment season this year runs from November 11 through December 9, 2024. This session will also cover the coordination of benefits between Medicare and the FEHBP plans, including the plans that now offer reimbursements for some or all of the Medicare Part B premiums and plans that integrate with Medicare part D, wither through EGWP plans or Medicare Advantage plans

Thursday, 11/21/2024: We are honored and delighted to announce that Congressman Jamie Raskin will be speaking at Oseh Shalom on the Rise of Antisemitism. He will address House bill HR6090, the Antisemitism Awareness Act of which he is a cosponsor.

Sunday, 12/8/2024 10 AM: *13 Drivers' Licenses* with Lisa Salko . This is a portable exhibit that tells the individual stories of 13 Jewish citizens who were persecuted during the Nazi regime in Lichtenfels, Germany. The story behind this exhibit is extraordinary as it involves the discovery of 13 drivers licenses in an old building, a local high school teacher using this discovery as a research project, and these students work to locate all of the familial descendants of each of these individuals. The students reached out to these families, and notified them about their findings.

Sunday, January 12 at 3 PM: Yiddish film- Ver Vet Blayn? [Who will remain?] A New Feature-Length Documentary Film from the Yiddish Book Center's Wexler Oral History Project. This film follows one woman's journey to understand her grandfather, the Yiddish writer Avrom Sutzkever. Followed by nosh.

Sunday, February 2 at 3 PM:Film: The Levys of Monticello

When Thomas Jefferson died in 1826, he left behind a mountain of personal debt, which forced his heirs to sell his beloved Monticello home and all of its possessions. *The Levys of Monticello* is a documentary film that tells the little-known story of the Levy family, which owned and carefully preserved Monticello for nearly a century – far longer than Jefferson or his descendants. The remarkable story of the Levy family intersects with slavery and the rise of antisemitism that runs throughout the course of American history. Followed by nosh.

Sunday, April 6 at 3 PM: Film- *Sugihara: Conspiracy of Kindness* 90-minute historical documentary that tells the remarkable story of Chiune Sugihara and the Jewish refugees that he helped to save. In the summer of 1940, at great personal risk, Sugihara made a decision that saved the lives of thousands. Followed by nosh.

Sunday, May 4 at noon: Lunch and the a cappella group Kol Sasson Founded in 1997 as the University of Maryland's premier Jewish a cappella group, Kol Sasson has been serving the national Jewish community with song for over twenty years. Comprised of students from all backgrounds, studies, and cities around the country, the members of Kol Sasson come together to perform a repertoire ranging from English and Israeli pop to traditional Jewish melodies, and more. Contribution of \$18 is suggested.

Montgomery County Board of Education Forum

You don't have to be a parent of a public school student to understand the impact of the Board of Education on individual citizens and the county as a whole. The Montgomery County League of Women Voters, JUFJ and other co-sponsors will be hosting an in-person candidate forum to help the public gain insight into the candidates running for seats on the School Board and where they stand on this year's hot-button issues.

Potential issues facing the new School Board include student cell phone use, handling cases of bullying and discrimination, efforts to narrow the achievement gap involving students of color and establishing a working relationship with the new Superintendent.
